Schedule H, Section I, Line 1a-f

Beginning in 2003 ETVA began an All-East Singer Scholarship program for high school students in east Tennessee in recognition of the eight students who achieved the highest All-East/All-State audition score for their respective voice part: Soprano 1, Soprano 2, Alto 1, Alto 2, Tenor 1, Tenor 2, Bass 1, and Bass 2. These scholarship awards are in the amount of \$100. Each year every student who participates in the All-East/All-State Audition process is eligible and is given consideration for a scholarship. Since all students who participate in the All-East/All-State Auditions must register prior to the event and all registered students are eligible for scholarship consideration, there is no separate scholarship application.

Schedule H, Section I, Line 3

To be eligible for an All-East Singer Scholarship a student must be in grades 10-12 and a member in good standing of a choral ensemble at their respective school. In addition they must register and participate in the All-East/All-State Auditions.

Schedule H, Section I, Line 4a-d

Currently, a scholarship is awarded to the student, in each of the All-East/All-State Audition voice part classifications: Soprano 1, Soprano 2, Alto 1, Alto 2, Tenor 1, Tenor

2, Bass 1, and Bass 2, who achieves the highest All-East/All-State Audition score for their respective voice part. A student's audition score is based on numerical ratings assigned by each adjudicator of a five-member adjudication panel that is comprised of ETVA members. Each adjudicator evaluates a student's audition on a scale of 1 to 50 for each of the following criteria: Tone, Musicality, Diction, Technical Accuracy, Pitch, and Rhythm. The student's audition score is tabulated by an Audition Manager computer program that drops the highest and lowest adjudicator's scores and then totals the average of the three remaining adjudicator's scores. This means of compiling a student's audition score is used in order to insure that there is no impartiality given to a student's audition by an adjudicator. The current number of 8 All-East Singer Scholarship awards is established each year by vote of the organization's membership at the annual Fall General Meeting. The amount of each All-East Singer Scholarship is determined yearly by available funds and a vote of the membership at the Fall General Meeting. A recipient of an All-East Singer Scholarship is eligible in future years to be considered for additional All-East Singer Scholarships if this person meets the criteria described above (includes Line 3).

Schedule H, Section I, Line 5

While the stated purpose of these scholarships is to recognize the achievements of each of the recipients and to encourage their further vocal and musical development, there are no specific terms that must be met by a recipient. Recipients are encouraged, but not required, by the sponsoring organization to use the funds in one or a combination of the

following ways: private vocal lessons, the purchase of music or compact discs, or concert attendance.

Schedule H, Section I, Line 6

Selection of All-East Singer Scholarships is made by the organization's Executive Board who serves for a two-year term and whose members are elected by the organization's membership. The current members are Michael Short, Chirs Clift, Neshawn Calloway, and David Stutzenberger.
